Read Gen 50:19-20 and Luke 15:31; What must we realize in order to have victory over the sin of envy and jealousy?

## Sins of the Tongue

Read James 3:3-6 What three things does James use as comparisons to your tongue? How do those three things compare with each other?

Which of the following would you consider to be a sin?  
*Lying, Critical Speech, Harsh Words, Profanity, Insults, Sarcasm, Gossip, Ridicule, Joking*

Read Eph 4:29 What does God’s Word prohibit in this verse? What does God’s Word command in this verse? Having read this verse, would you reconsider any responses to the list above?

Read Luke 6:43-45 What does Jesus use as an example of the impact of the marks of our speech? How does that example make you feel about what others hear you say? What does Jesus identify as the source of the words we speak?
