

# Home Group Discussion Questions

1. How do you define contentment? What does it look like to be content? What is the enemy of contentment, in your life?

2. Read 1 Timothy 6:6-10. When a section begins with words like “but” or “therefore”, it is good to look back a few verses for context. Looking back at verses 3-5, what is Paul comparing regarding the types of godliness and gain to start verse 6?

What is Paul’s argument regarding contentment in verses 7-8? In order to obtain this contentment, what do you need to flee from, give up, or avoid? What godly things do you need to pursue?

3. How does Paul relate money with evil in verse 10. What are two things that have happened to some people who have been eager for money? Think of practical examples of each...

Explain the difference between the statements “money is the root of all evil” and “the love of money is the root of all evil”. What difference does this make?

4. Read verses 17-20. What is the command here? How does this relate to your answer above, about the difference between the two statements?

5. What blessings have you received that you need to view as gifts from God? Take time as a group to list out the blessings, specifically, that you have received.

What is the connection between receiving these things as gifts from God and being content?

6. In what ways are you using God’s blessings to bless others? Is God asking you to raise your standard of giving in order to bless others more? How could you be more of a blessing?
